BINGHAM – Tamar Diamond, DMD will be returning to Bingham Area Health Center in April after spending a year in Arizona. Dr. Diamond originally relocated from Wisconsin where she worked at a community health center for over 10 years providing general dentistry to adults and children. She first joined Bingham Area Health Center in 2012 and quickly became a fixture at the practice.

Dr. Diamond will be joining Dr. Dmytruk as well as hygienists Marie Doucette and Jacquelyn Watson-Arsenault to provide oral healthcare to people of all ages. The center serves over 2,500 people from Bingham, Caratunk, Embden, Moscow, Pleasant Ridge, Solon, and surrounding towns each year.
