KINGFIELD – The National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) has announced that Mt Abram Regional Health Center of Kingfield has received level 3 NCQA Patient-Centered Medical Home (PCMH) Recognition for using evidence-based, patient-centered processes that focus on highly coordinated care and long-term, participative relationships.

The NCQA Patient-Centered Medical Home is a model of primary care that combines teamwork and information technology to improve care, improve patients' experience of care and reduce costs. [Research](#) shows that medical homes can lead to higher quality and lower costs, and can improve patient and provider reported experiences of care.
